INTRODUCTION

Join wildlife photographer Juan Álvarez for a unique 7-day photographic safari in Chobe National Park, Botswana—renowned for its vast elephant herds and stunning river landscapes.

This unforgettable journey also includes a full-day visit to Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World.

Our base: a comfortable safari lodge perfectly positioned for action-packed days and well-deserved rest.

Optional: enhance your well-being with daily yoga sessions (with Mavi Mariscal).

WHO IS IT FOR?

Beginner, amateur, enthusiast, semi-pro and pro photographers. Any camera gear welcome (DSLR, mirrorless, compact, smartphone). Also perfect for any nature lover who wants to experience an authentic African safari, even if photography is not their primary focus.

ACTIVITIES

- 2–3 daily game drives in open 4x4 vehicles through Chobe National Park, tracking elephants, big cats, and more.
- Two scenic boat safaris along the Chobe River (Days 3 and 6)—ideal for photographing wildlife from

- unique angles and capturing magical reflections.
- Full-day excursion to Victoria Falls (Zimbabwe), including a guided walk to the viewpoints and time to explore local markets.
- Daily 1-hour photography workshop with Juan Álvarez (@safaris.juan): Days 2, 3, 5, and 6.
- Optional daily yoga sessions with Mavi Mariscal—ideal for restoring body and mind between game drives.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

- 6 nights accommodation at Tlou Safari Lodge (or similar).
- Daily breakfast and overnight stay.
- All 4x4 game drives and boat safaris in Chobe National Park.
- Chobe National Park fees, both land and river access.

- Visa fees for Botswana or Zimbabwe (if applicable, depending on nationality).
- Beverages.
- International and domestic flights.
- Travel insurance.
- Tips/gratuities for guides and lodge staff.
- Any other item not expressly mentioned as included.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION – FAQs

Q: Which airport should I fly to?

A: You should book your international flights to Kasane International Airport (BBK) in Botswana. Round-trip airport transfers between Kasane and the lodge are included in the itinerary.

Q: Do I need a visa?

A:

- Botswana: Many nationalities (EU, USA, Canada, Australia, etc.) do not require a visa for short stays.
- Zimbabwe (Victoria Falls): Most nationalities can obtain a visa on arrival, currently 50 USD for a single entry.

Always check with your local embassy for the latest requirements based on your nationality.

Q: Are vaccinations required?

A: No vaccinations are mandatory for Botswana or Zimbabwe unless you are arriving from a yellow fever endemic country.

We strongly recommend being up to date on routine vaccines and considering malaria prophylaxis. Always consult your travel doctor before departure.

Q: Is this a malaria-free area?

A: No. Chobe and Victoria Falls are malaria-risk areas, especially in the wet season. We recommend taking antimalarial medication and protecting yourself with insect repellent and long sleeves in the evenings.

Q: Is there electricity at the lodge?

A: Yes, there is full electricity at the lodge, including charging points for your camera gear and other essentials. We recommend bringing extra batteries and memory cards.

Q: Should I bring cash for tips?

A: While tipping is not mandatory, it is customary and appreciated if you feel satisfied with the service. As a general guideline:

- Around 5–10 USD per guest per day for the general lodge staff.
- Around 10 USD per day for guides and drivers.

Please bring small denominations in USD, EUR or BWP if you'd like to contribute.

Q: What should I pack?

A: We recommend:

- Lightweight, breathable clothing in neutral tones.

- A warm layer for early morning drives.
- A wide-brimmed hat, sunscreen, insect repellent.
- Camera gear, binoculars, personal medications.
- A reusable water bottle and sandals or comfortable shoes for the lodge.







Terms and Conditions:

Confirmed reservation: A reservation is only confirmed upon written confirmation and payment

of a 30% deposit of the total amount. (Non-refundable).

Final payments: The final payment must be made at least 3 months before departure. If the company does not receive the final payment by the due date, we reserve the right to cancel all arrangements without notice. Reservations made within 3 months prior to departure will only be processed with full payment. (Non-refundable).

Insurance: It is mandatory for clients to purchase comprehensive travel insurance, including cancellation insurance, taking into account any unforeseen events that may arise.

It is the responsibility of guests to obtain insurance that covers expenses from the moment of deposit payment until the conclusion of the reserved services. Comprehensive travel and cancellation insurance is required for all our safaris, and quests are expected to cover any costs related to cancellation fees, medical care (including medical repatriation if necessary), loss or damage to personal belongings, and any loss of cash they bring with them. Most cancellations will occur for reasons covered within the terms of a quest's travel insurance policy, and their travel insurers should reimburse

applicable cancellation fees, subject to the terms of their policy. However, if the coverage is insufficient, guests are expected to cover any shortfall themselves.

Trip cancellation: In the event that the minimum seats for the trip are not filled (6), the trip will be canceled and the total amount paid will be refunded.
